Peabody Energy is the world's largest private-sector coal company and a Fortune 500 company serving metallurgical and thermal coal customers in 25 countries on six continents.

- Our portfolio is shaped around core regions in the Powder River Basin, the Illinois Basin and Australia, which have some of the best market access.
- The company has 26 surface and underground operations and sold 228.8 million tons of coal to global electric utilities and industrial plants this past year. We are the largest producer of coal in the United States and the fifth-largest producer in Australia.
- Peabody benefits from an unmatched asset base, strong underlying operations, and a new management team offering fresh perspectives. With a global workforce of 7,100, we view safety as a core value and a leading measure of operational excellence.
- In 2015, Peabody set a new global safety record with a 1.25 incidence rate per 200,000 hours worked, a 13 percent improvement from the prior year. Our Australian operations improved the safety rate by 26 percent, also marking a historic best.
- Peabody's flagship North Antelope Rochelle Mine (NARM) is the world's largest and most productive coal mine, which shipped its 2 billionth ton of coal this past year. By itself, NARM fueled 5 percent of the electricity used in the United States last year, over eight times the power than all the solar power in the nation.
- We view land restoration as an essential part of the mining process, take great pride in the work that we do and have been consistently recognized for these programs.
- In 2015, the company restored over 4,700 acres of mined lands globally, including rangeland, wildlife habitat, hardwood forests, prime farmland and wetlands. This includes over 180 acres of forested area, over 315 acres of ponds and lakes, more than 20 acres of marshes and wetlands and seven miles of high-quality streams. In addition, Peabody planted approximately 442,000 trees.
- Peabody is a global leader in sustainable mining, energy access and clean coal solutions. Since 2000, the company has earned more than 90 major honors for safety, environmental and social achievements.
